**RALEIGH** - North Carolina State University Head Women’s Basketball Coach Kay Yow will serve as the honorary chair of a student-led food and funds competition called HOOPS 4 HUNGER in February. The food and funds drive benefits the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina and is open to all colleges and universities in the organization’s 34-county service area.

From the 1<sup>st</sup> of February through the 29<sup>th</sup> of February, colleges and universities can participate in a friendly food and funds competition to restock depleted shelves and support operational services at the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina.

“This is a fun way for students to show school pride, for die-hard basketball fans to support their favorite college team and for alumni to have a food fight, while at the same time support the increasing need for food and services to thousands of individuals in the local community,” said Peter Werbicki, President/CEO of the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina.

The university collecting the highest per capita total by February 29, 2008 at 3pm will be deemed the winner and announced at the winner’s final home basketball game in March.

The Food Bank will award a Hoops 4 Hunger Trophy engraved with the school name and year beginning a tradition of displaying the trophy at the winning school for an entire year before passing to the following year’s winner.

Schools, fans, and alumni can check the Food Bank’s web site at any time during February to keep up with their school’s progress.
