**TAKE TIME TO HELP OTHERS AT THE N.C. STATE FAIR**

***Food Lion Hunger Relief Day Set for Thursday***

**RALEIGH** – The 2008 theme of the N.C. State Fair is “Take Time for a Great Time.” Food and fun are present from beginning to end. On Thursday, October 23<sup>rd</sup>, during Food Lion Hunger Relief Day, fairgoers are encouraged to take time to help families who may not have food and definitely are not having fun during the economic downturn. Fairgoers can bring four cans of food to any entrance gate and receive free admission to the fair. Hunger Relief Day at the Fair is one of the largest one-day canned-food drives in the state and benefits the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina.

Last year 174,000 pounds of food, the equivalent of about 147,000 meals, was donated by fair attendees.

The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina will have close to 450 volunteers and staff members on site throughout the day to collect the canned goods at all gates in exchange for admission tickets. The Food Bank will distribute the cans of food collected to families in need in its 34 county service area, including its branch locations in Durham, Greenville, Southern Pines and Wilmington. The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina will also distribute collected cans to sister food banks across the state.

The N.C. State Fair opened on October 16 and runs through October 26.

***About the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina***

The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina is a nonprofit organization that provides food for people at risk of hunger in 34 counties in central and eastern North Carolina. The Food Bank serves a network of nearly 900 partner agencies such as soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, and programs for children and adults. In fiscal year 2007-2008, the Food Bank distributed nearly 32 million pounds of food and non-food essentials through these agencies. Sadly, hunger remains a serious problem in central and eastern North Carolina. In these counties, more than 450,000 individuals struggle each day to provide enough food for their families.
