## Food Bank Urges Fans to Host **SOUPER BOWL** Parties

### ***Sports Community Urged to Collect and Donate During Game***

**GREENVILLE** – For the second year, The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina is challenging communities in its 34-county service area to show TEAM SPIRIT and COMMUNITY SPIRIT by collecting or donating food at parties this year during Super Bowl XLIII on Sunday, February first. Whether you are a Pittsburgh Steelers fan or an Arizona Cardinals fan, everyone wins in the Food Bank's **S-O-U-P-E-R BOWL!** Fight hunger in your community by collecting or bringing cans of food to a Super Bowl Party or by making an Online Virtual Food Drive Donation.

“This call to action engages our sports fans in the fight against hunger. Food collected during major food drives go right back out the door to feed those at risk of hunger, particularly with agencies like the pantries, rescue missions and soup kitchens that depend on us seeing a 30 to 50 percent increase in the individuals seeking food assistance,” said Peter Werbicki, President/CEO of the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina. “We want to keep the community engaged in our mission to provide food resources throughout the year.”

For **every dollar** donated, the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina is able to distribute generally **8 dollars (\$8) worth of food or provide four meals.**

The **Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina at Greenville** is located on 497 West 9<sup>th</sup> Street. The Greenville branch distributes food to partner agencies (rescue missions, soup kitchens, food pantries, after school programs, elderly nutrition programs) in Carteret, Craven, Edgecombe, Greene, Jones Lenoir, Onslow, Pamlico, Pitt, and Wilson counties.
