Food Bank Focuses on Seniors during Difficult Economic Times *Cisco Grant Makes Food & Nutrition Services Outreach Possible*

GREENVILLE – On **Wednesday, February 11th**, the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina will launch the **Food and Nutrition Services Program Outreach Project in Pitt County**. This program was formerly known as the Food Stamp Program. Funded by the Cisco Foundation, this project allows the Food Bank to team up with the local Department of Social Services and allows two select agencies in Pitt County, **Philippi Church of Christ** in Greenville and **The Anointed Ones Church** in Ayden, to connect the senior citizens who rely on emergency assistance programs for food to the Food and Nutrition Services Program.

Recognizing the importance of ensuring seniors in our communities have access to the most essential food resources, **The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina at Greenville** will host a press launch to build awareness around the project from **10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at Philippi Church of Christ, 3760 Philippi Drive in Greenville.**

Through partnership and support from Pitt County's Department of Social Services (DSS), **the two selected agencies** will be able to increase access to the Food and Nutrition Services Program through:

- educating seniors about the benefits of FNS Program participation;
- promoting facts about the FNS Program;
- providing a basic understanding of eligibility requirements; and
- explaining the process of applying for benefits;

Representatives from the **Cisco Foundation**, Philippi Church of Christ, Anointed Ones Church, DSS and the Food Bank will be present and make brief comments. County and civic leaders have been invited to attend.

Partner agencies from Moore and New Hanover Counties have also been selected to participate in the Food and Nutrition Services Program Outreach Project

Press launches are also scheduled in Moore and New Hanover counties this week.

The **Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina at Greenville** is located on 497 West 9th Street. The Greenville branch distributes food to partner agencies (rescue missions, soup kitchens, food pantries, after school programs, elderly nutrition programs) in Carteret, Craven, Edgecombe, Greene, Jones Lenoir, Onslow, Pamlico, Pitt, and Wilson counties.
